Clerks Report for January 23

Playing Field:

The latches have been replaced on the playing field gates; they are of a better quality, but I am not sure how long they will last. The quality of the gates is not great, and I have been chasing the contractor throughout January to have issues resolved. The eye piece on the binoculars have been broken beyond repair and a new set have been ordered after consultation with the Playing field Committee.

The base of the carousel has been sanded down and painted as it was beginning to rust.

Quotes have been received and circulated to all for the removal of the fly tipping behind the fence in the Playing field.

We have received reports of dogs not being kept on leads within the playing field. The gates to the children's play area have not been closing due to the latch being broken so this has meant that dogs have been able to gain access. An article asking dog owners to be more responsible has been placed in the community news and the in the newsletter for the community website.

Cemetery:

Our staff have started tidying the path edges. Two wire deck brushes have been ordered and two of our staff have been tasked with the moss removal.

The ivy removal has been started for the wall repairs.

General:

The grit bin on Carne Hill has been re-filled following the recent cold spell, levels are being monitored by our staff.

Flooding at white gates has been reported into the office, Cornwall Council have been contacted and action has been taken to alleviate the issue. The leat running through the area needed to be cleared. Flooding on the road at Hendra Prazey (outside the new building site) has also been reported through Cornwall Council.

The Trelavour Prazey sign has been re-painted and re-installed on the green.

2 broken sluice valve signs have been reported to SWW and have now been collected.

The bench on Hendra corner is beginning to show signs or rot on the back slats. We will be looking for quotes to have this issue rectified.

There is currently no update on the sale of the Hendra Prazey land.
